Birmingham Archives & Heritage also holds many sketchbooks and photographs, which may provide views of landscape and gardens.

There are also rentals and plans, title deeds etc. for various estates, such as the Colmore Estates; the Elford Hall Estate; Gough Estates; the Inge Estates; the Taylor Estates. Many of these estates are in counties neighbouring Birmingham.

The catalogues are not usually detailed enough to guarantee that there is anything about gardens, though there may be!

Loudon collection

This is a special collection of publications by John Claudius Loudon (1783-1843) and Jane Loudon (d. 1858). John Claudius Loudon wrote an *Encyclopaedia of gardening* (1822), the monthly *Gardeners' magazine* (1826-), and numerous other works on plants and agriculture. He was responsible for laying out Birmingham Botanical Gardens in 1830/31. Jane Loudon (née Webb) also wrote numerous 'popular' botanical works, especially flower and gardening books for 'ladies', (as well as *The Mummy* !! (1827)).
