# The National Gas Archive

The National Gas Archive is owned by National Grid Transco, and is located at Warrington. The archive has recently moved from Partington, Manchester, where it was located in an adapted compressor house on the site of Partington gas works. The new archive building will eventually house over half a mile of records relating to the gas industry.

The records of the National Gas Archive fall into two distinct categories: the records of the twelve regions since 1949 and the predecessor gas companies and undertaking which were absorbed at nationalisation and the records of the central administration of the gas industry including the gas Council and the corporate records of the British Gas Corporation and its successors.
