### **The Early Period**

Aston Churchwardens' Accounts, 1644-1639

Northfield Churchwardens' Accounts, 1643-1699

(These accounts relate to the Irish passing through these two parishes. The earliest named Irishman, John Conly, appears in the Northfield Accounts in July 1684.)

Franciscan Register 1657-1824

(The Baptismal registers especially, lists Irish families living in Birmingham. From 1785 the Irish parents are listed as 'Hibernii'.

Trade Directories, 1767-

(The first directory, Sketchley's, lists 6 Irish artisans)

Rate Books, 1736-1800

## The early 19<sup>th</sup> Century

IIR 28 Finigan, Thomas A., Journal of, 1837-38.

Darwall, Dr John, 'Observations on the medical Topography of Birmingham', in 'The Midland Medical and Surgical Reporter & Topographical and Statistical Journal', vol. 1, 1828-29. (A brief reference to the Irish, living in a definable Quarter)

Piggot Smith, J. Map of Birmingham, 1828

(A very detailed map, necessary for locating the Irish Quarter)

Piggot Smith, J. Map of Birmingham, c. 1850

(A large scale map of the town, showing the Irish Quarter in even greater detail.)

Journal of Thomas Augustin Finigan, Missionary, 1837-1838. [ IIR 28, 312749] (Every day life in the Irish Quarter from the journal of a religious bigot.)

Census, 1851

(Essential for any serious study of the Irish in Birmingham. The majority of immigrants came from Connaught.)

Birmingham Catholic Magazine, Vol 2, No. 19, October 1913. p.389. Park Street and the Oratory.

(A brief account of the Roman Catholic Church's establishment of a school and church in the Quarter in 1847)



# The Late 19<sup>th</sup> Century

**Biographical Newscuttings**

Kelly's Directory, 1890-96

(Useful for analysis of the progress and position of the Irish community in English society. By 1894 the Commercial section of the directory shows a number of Irish in the professions, as manufacturers, and in the service trades. The court section shows the dispersal of what was then an established Irish population.

Census, 1841-1901 [Printed] (Located in Social Sciences)

Woodward's Biographical Index

(An index to biographical material, which includes several native-born and Birminghamborn Irishmen who, lived in the city during the 1860-1914 period.)

Biographical Newscuttings index, 1872-1900

(Includes the biographies and obituaries of several Irish people.)

# Early 20<sup>th</sup> Century

Kelly's Directories, 1900-1939

(References to Irish in Birmingham in the Court and Commercial sections. From 1898 there are entries for the Irish National Club.)

Birmingham Centenary Irish Festival, 1889-1989

(References to the original Gaelic League, suppressed in 1916, and Gaelic sports.)

Birmingham Daily Mail, 15<sup>th</sup> Nov, 1904

('Birmingham's Sons of Erin'-A brief account of the Gaelic league's activities in Birmingham)

The Birmingham Catholic Magazine, May 1919-March 1920

(Irish Notes & Comments column. Mainly trivia, but one or two very pointed articles.)

Birmingham Weekly Post, December 1904

(An account of the Irish Industries Association exhibition, held at Bingley Hall. Irish craft industries, 'Sponsored' by titled ladies.)

National Roll of the Great War

(Brief biographies/obituaries, of Irish Brummies who fought in World War 1.)



#### Biography Newscuttings

(Also contains material relating to Irish-Brummies who fought in the war.)

#### Census, 1921 [Printed] (Located in <u>Social Sciences</u>)

(Irish in Birmingham now divided into Irish Free State and Northern Ireland.)

#### Cornish's Birmingham yearbook 1925-1939

(The Who's Who section has a number of Irish people listed.)

Fairfield, Letitia, 'The Trial of Peter Barnes and others', 1953

(An account of the trial of the Coventry bombers. It also contains a list of bombers convicted in Birmingham.)

History & Topography Newscuttings, 1939

(Contains a number of references to the I.R.A's bombing campaign in the Midlands.)

## Bell, J. Bowyer, 'The Secret Army'.

(Contains a brief history of the I.R.A's bombing campaign in the Midlands.)

#### World War II and its aftermath

Biographical Newscuttings 1939-1945

(Irish men in the forces, and civilians awarded medals for bravery on the Home Front.)

#### Birmingham Centenary Irish Festival 1889-1989

(Article by Tom Hayes, about the recruiting of Irish labour during World War II)

'Anti-Irish Partition League-Eamon De Valera in Birmingham'

(De Valera's 3 day visit to Birmingham in January 1949, when he spoke in the Town hall in favour of the unification of Ireland.)

Birmingham Gazette, 31<sup>st</sup> January 1949

(Details concerning De Valera's visit.)

Kelly's Directory 1943-1955

(Gives details of the establishment of Irish organisations in Birmingham.)

Birmingham Post Year Book, 1949-1950

(References to the establishment of Irish societies in Birmingham.)

(Three articles relating to the Irish in Birmingham.)

Irish Mail

(A series of articles which appeared in the Saturday edition of the Birmingham Evening Mail from the 16<sup>th</sup> Dec. 1967-18<sup>th</sup> May 1973. Every day activities of the Irish community.)

Midland Catholic Pictorial 1960-1964

(Occasional references to, and activities of, the Irish in the West Midlands.)

Loose Leaf File (Newscuttings), 'The Irish in Birmingham'(A small collection of cuttings relating to the Irish in the city.)

Birmingham Post yearbook 1949-1969

(The Who's Who section has a growing number of entries relating to Irish Brummies.)

Biographical Newscuttings 1950-1969 (Irish biographies and obituaries.)

Birmingham Gazette, 15 June 1956, p4. 'Jobs but no homes to go to'. (An article which made aware that though the Irish were welcome to fill vacancies in Birmingham factories, finding somewhere to live was not always so easy.)

Sunday Mercury, 15 January 1961, 'The Shame of the Twilight Houses'. (The Irish Labourer and his family living in slum housing)

#### The 1970s

Loose leaf File (Newscuttings), 'The Irish in Birmingham' (Material from the 1970s dealing with the Civil Rights Movement in Northern I Ireland, The Peace Movement, etc)

News Society, 20<sup>th</sup> September 1973, pp 699-702, 'The Irish English' (Located in <u>Social</u> Sciences)

(An account of the Irish in Birmingham, particularly the attitudes of those born in England.)

Robertson, Geoffrey, `Lennon: a case to answer. New Statesman, 15<sup>th</sup> November 1974 (Kenneth Lennon, a British agent provocateur, attempted to recruit Irishmen into an `I.R.A Unit' with a view to betraying them.)

Midland Bombings newscuttings

(The Provisional I.R.A bombings of the mid-1970s, culminating in the Pub Bombing.)

Gibson, Brian, The Birmingham Bombs

(Published soon after the conviction of the Birmingham Six)

Faul, Fr Denis, 'The Birmingham Framework', 1977 (Located in <u>Local Studies and History</u>)

(The first book to question that justice had been perverted to convict the Birmingham Six)



Mullin, Chris, 'Error of Judgement'

(An investigation into the Birmingham Pub Bombings, and the evidence to suggest that the Birmingham Six are innocent.)

The Case of the Birmingham 6
(Produced by the Troops Out Movement)

Burke, Aggrey, W, 'Attempted suicide among the Irish-born population in Birmingham, 1976'

(One of the more tragic aspects of Irish immigrants unable to come to terms with their new life.)

Statistics 1981-1985

(Includes statistical details of the Irish population in Birmingham , suburb by suburb.)

Birmingham Centenary Irish festival Programme, 1989 (Full of material relating to Irish organisations in Birmingham)
