Purpose: To give instruction and advice re: A.R.P, give air raid warnings, organise Wardens, recruit and train personnel for A.R.P scheme, distribute respirators, collect and distribute information on air raid casualties and damage.

Purpose: To appoint a new councillor to the A.R.P (Air Warden's) Sub Committee.

Purpose: To organise for an emergency fire brigade service, including such provision as is necessary for auxiliary fire stations, fire patrols and fire posts. To arrange for natural and static water supplies. To recruit and train personnel for fie and other duties.
